








In assemblies this week, we reflected on our shared value of trust. We enjoyed listening to several stories and considered the following questions:

Nursery have been investigating water. In our story Mr Archimedes' Bath, the water in his bath rose and fell as he and the animals got in and out. We decided to have an experiment with water and stones to see what would happen. Do you know what? The water rose as we added the stones!



Reception class had their first session with Chef Jamois this week. They grated carrots and cut peppers to make some deliciously healthy rainbow salads.

This week the children in Class 1 have been excited to start a new English text The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch. They have been learning new vocabulary in the book such as concocted.


Starting gymnastics this week was exciting. The children had a go at jumping and leaping thinking about their dismount and forward rolls.





This week in Class 2 we have been learning how to write an information text in English. This is about our science topic on plants and we have made sure we have included headings, subheading, paragraphs and used scientific vocabulary. In art, we have been learning how to design a puppet. We drew and labelled the resources we will be using to create our puppet this week, in preparation for getting started with the production of them next week!

Class 4 have been experimenting to find out which materials are good conductors of electricity and which are not and are therefore insulators. With their learning partner they set up a working circuit with a bulb. One at a time they added a different material into the circuit to see if the electricity was still able to flow through/conduct to light the bulb.







Class 5 have started their new topic this week based on the book The Great Kapok Tree. We will be learning about the Amazon Rainforest and why it is important. This week, we used atlases to find which countries have the largest rainforest coverage. Did you know that the Amazon rainforest is home to more than 2,000 different species?

Class 6 started reading the story 'Way Home'. We began to think about the important themes that run through this story which include homelessness and poverty. We are looking forward to researching a little more about homelessness in order for us to write our very own reports!
